With Christmas just around the corner it is easy to over indulge with all the lovely festive food. Unfortunately we often overfeed our pets thinking we are treating them, BUT did you know obesity in dogs and cats is a very common problem affecting I in 3 pets within the UK?

Sometimes we may not be aware that our pets have a weight problem, and therefore, are unaware of the risks to our pets' health. Being overweight can greatly increase the risk of pets developing conditions such as diabetes mellitus, heart disease and arthritis.

Although some diseases can cause obesity, the main reason for pets becoming overweight is that the food they eat contains more energy than they use up. This means that if they eat too much, or eat foods high in calories, or do not do enough exercise, they may become overweight. Other contributing factors include your pets' age, breed and whether or not they have been neutered.

It is very easy for even the most diligently cared-for pet to put on weight.

Along with having a negative impact on your pets' well-being and quality of life, excess weight can also significantly shorten their life expectancy.

So please remember your pet does not know it is Christmas and does not expect all the treats that we associate with the festive season. A nice long walk for your dog and a cosy rug by the fire is all the treats your pet will need.

Is your pet Microchipped?

TOWN & COUNTRY VETERINARY GROUP BACK

It's a sad fact that hundreds of pets go missing every day and many are never reunited with their owners for one simple reason, tragically, they cannot be reliably identified.

However, the good news is that, in addition to the traditional collar and engraved tag (which doesn't always stay in place), you can now have your pet permanently identified with a tiny microchip, giving you the best chance of being re-united with your pet, should they go missing.

A range of pets can be Microchipped including dogs, cats, small pets, and birds. A microchip is hardly bigger than a grain of rice and having it implanted is quick and simple. Like a normal injection, it is inserted under the skin at the back of the neck and once there, it lasts a lifetime. Each microchip carries a unique code which, together with information about your pet and your contact details, are held on a central computer database. Should your pet go missing, when found, the chip can be read using a hand held scanner. Veterinary practices, the police and animal welfare organisations routinely scan all strays, hopefully ensuring that if the unthinkable happens, you and your pet can be speedily reunited. So—don't take any chances! Get your pet Microchipped today.

Don't forget the wild life!

Adding a new Pet to the family is never a good idea at Christmas time but if you decide to introduce a pet into the family in spring time here are a few guide line:

Please remember it is a big responsibility:

Vaccination: One of the key reason pets are living longer is that we are able to vaccinate them against a range of infectious diseases that, without regular vaccination, pose a deadly threat to our pets. Regular booster vaccinations, combined with a health check, are the best way of protecting your pet, plus at the same time keeping a watchful eye out for any emerging health issues.

Fleas: most puppies and kittens will arrive with a fair number of fleas, so it is a good idea for us to give them a check over on arrival. Spot on treatments are ideal for treating your pets, whilst household sprays are great for treating your home.

Worming: If their parents were not regularly de-wormed, there is a very high prevalence of roundworm infection in puppies and kittens. As they grow up they are susceptible to infection with both round worm and tapeworm and will require worming treatments. Also, lungworm is posing an increasing threat for many dogs.

Diets: We can now offer pets a tailored series of diets from tiny kittens to puppies, through adult hood and into their senior years. These diets are designed to offer the ideal balance of nutrients for each life stage.

Microchip: It is important to get your pet identified as soon as possible. As well as a collar and tag, we also recommend having your pet Microchipped as a more secure and permanent form of identification. Pet Insurance: You might want to consider covering your pet against those unexpected vet bills.

Your pet could become seriously ill because of the rock salt and antifreeze being used during the cold snap.

Road clearing gritters and car drivers who have used de-icer, leave substances on the roads. Our dogs and cats can walk through these chemicals and then lick their paws.

Consuming rock salt can cause dehydration, liver failure and pancreatitis, while antifreeze contains the chemical ethylene glycol, which can be lethal when ingested.

Always clean your pets' paws after walking in a gritted area.
